
Mission Statement

In Jesus' day, tax collectors were collaborators with the Romans and not liked by the Jewish. The tax system allowed them to charge more than what was required so that they could make a profit for themselves. Thus, they were considered sinners by their countrymen. Observers in the crowd that day grumble because Jesus dines with a sinner. In first century Jewish culture, to dine together was to show a bond of fellowship and peace among those at the table. Observant Jews did not generally dine with foreigners and sinners. Yet, Jesus chooses to eat with this rejected tax collector. In welcoming Jesus and in his conversion of heart, Zacchaeus is raised up by Jesus as a model of salvation.



Then Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house, because Zacchaeus too is a son of Abraham. For the Son of Man came to seek out to save the lost."

Masses for All Saints Day and Commemoration of all the faithful departed

On Tuesday, November 1st, it will be All Saints Day. On Wednesday November 2nd, it will be the Commemoration of all the faithful departed (All Soul's Day) Therefore, on Tuesday, November 1st, Mass will be at 7 PM instead of 11:30 AM during the day. It will give everyone the opportunity to come to Mass and to pray for our loved ones who have passed away hoping that each one of them is in Heaven with all the Saints. On Wednesday, November 2nd, Mass will be at 11:30 AM. O God, be merciful to me...

"Zacchaeus, come down quickly for I must stay at your house today."

Today, it looks as if the Evangelic narrative was the accomplishment of the parable of the Pharisee and the tax collector (cf. Lk 18:9-14). Humbly and sincerely, the tax collector was praying from the bottom of his heart, "O God, be merciful to me a sinner" (Lk 18:13); and, today, we contemplate how Jesus Christ honors Zacchaeus' repentance by forgiving him, the Jericho chief tax collector, a wealthy and influent man, though hated and underrated by his neighbors, who felt bled by him: "Zacchaeus, come down quickly for I must stay at your house today." (Lk 19:5) This divine forgiveness provokes the conversion of Zacchaeus; this is one of the originalities of the Gospel: God's forgiveness is free; it is not that God forgives us because of our conversion, but the other way round: God's mercy sort of impels us to feel grateful and reciprocate accordingly.

As Jesus, on his way to Jerusalem, passes through Jericho, Jesus passes through our life, today and every day, and calls us by name. Zacchaeus had never seen Jesus before, but he had heard of him and was curious to know more about such famous master. Jesus, instead, did know Zacchaeus and the miseries of his life. Jesus was aware of the fact Zacchaeus had enriched himself to the injury of others and was, therefore, hated and rejected by his fellow citizens; this is why He passed through Jericho, to rescue him from that well: "The Son of Man has come to seek and to save the lost." (Lk 19:10)

The encounter between the Master and the tax collector totally changed the latter's life. After having listened to this Gospel, ponder over the opportunity God is offering you, which you cannot neglect: Jesus Christ passes through your life and calls you by name, because He loves you and He wants to save you. Which well did you fall in? As Zacchaeus climbed up to that tree to better see Jesus, you can now climb up to the Cross along with Jesus and you will know who is He, you will know the immensity of his love, inasmuch as if "The chief among the Publicans is here fitly introduced: For who will hereafter despair of himself, now that he attains to grace who gained his living by fraud?" (St. Ambrose)
